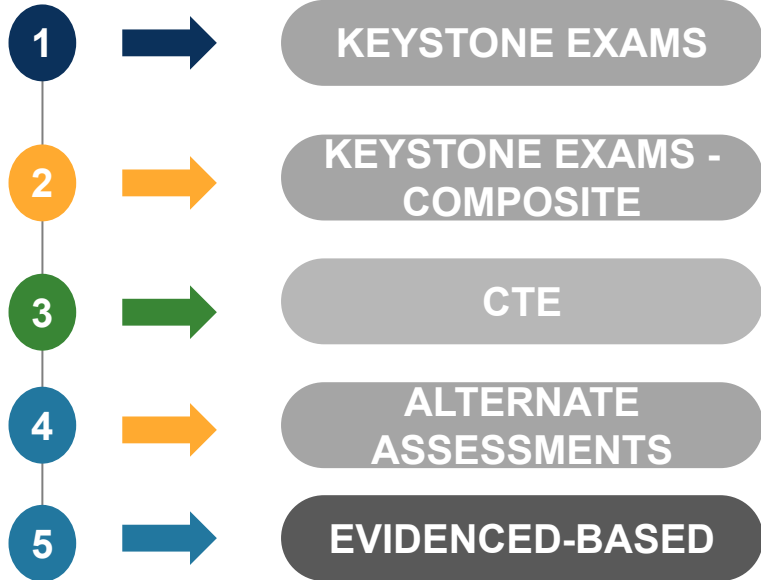

Pathway 5 - Evidence-Based



HIGHLIGHT: *THREE (3) Pieces of Evidence Required*

At least **one** of the following:

- ~~Alternative assessment~~ **WorkKeys(Silver)*, AP(3), IB(3)**
- **Acceptance into an accredited nonprofit** institution of higher education and have evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework in other than 4-year institution *
- ~~Successful completion of a concurrent dual enrollment~~
- ~~Successful completion of a postsecondary course*~~
- **Attainment of an Industry-recognized Credentials (Non-CTE students)***

Up to two of the following:

- **Service Learning** project completion (i.e. Senior Project)
- Letter guaranteeing **full time employment or military enlistment**
- **Internship** or Cooperative Education Program
- Compliance with **NCAA's** course for college bound student athletes

Remember: all students must meet local graduation requirements: credits/passing courses

AND

Earn a passing grade in content area where student did not score proficient on Keystone exam

Acceptance into a Nonprofit Institution ... Less Than 4 Years

- May not be an unconditional acceptance
 - No summer bridge
 - No remediated courses
- Trade schools do not offer conditional acceptances
- Your acceptance must be on file with Ms. Guerrier - bring in your letters!

It is your responsibility to bring in your acceptance letter.

A copy of your acceptance letter is sufficient.

Attainment of an Industry-recognized Credentials (Non-CTE students)*

- Must be **in alignment** with your post-high school goals (for example, a CPR certification if you are interested in medicine)
- They are an added expense for you
- You have to schedule and study for these credentials on your own.
- You **must** bring a copy of your certificate when you receive them. It is best to start this now!

It is your responsibility to bring in your certification.

Attainment of an Industry-recognized Credentials (Non-CTE students)* (cont.)

- Be mindful, some of the certifications listed are extremely difficult to get without taking additional coursework
- The District is recognizing certificates from the agencies listed on the handout **only**.

Letter Guaranteeing Full-Time Employment or Military Enlistment: Post-Graduation

- 30 hours/week **or** 130 hours/month
 - Can be spread over 2+ jobs (each with its own letter)
 - Employment must begin within 30 days of your high school graduation.
 - Must be on file with Ms. Guerrier

It is your responsibility to bring in your letter(s).

Service Learning Project

- Short term project that addresses real-world or school needs
- Must be aligned to academic coursework and your post-high school interests
- Project must be pre-approved by the school. You are responsible for developing your service learning project. I am available to assist by appointment.
- You can (**are are encouraged to**) work in a team
- Must be 10+ hours

It is your responsibility to complete your service learning project.

Service Learning Project

New:

- Portfolio that highlights your experience
 - Samples of written work
 - Photographs
 - Videos
 - Reports
 - summaries/other documentation of learning outcomes

It is your responsibility to complete your service learning project.

Service Learning Project

New:

- In addition:
 - Reflective journaling
 - Topical paper
 - Facilitated reflection meetings

It is your responsibility to complete your service learning project.

Compliance with NCAAs Course for College Bound Student Athletes

The good news:

GPA is 2.2 or Higher

DIVISION II ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

To study and compete at a **Division II school**, you must earn 16 NCAA-approved **core-course credits**, earn a corresponding test score* that matches your **core-course GPA** and submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

CORE-COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:

ENGLISH	MATH (Algebra I or higher)	SCIENCE (Including one year of lab, if offered)	ADDITIONAL (English, math or science)	SOCIAL SCIENCE	ADDITIONAL COURSES (Any area listed to the left, world language or non-doctrinal religion/philosophy)
3 years	2 years	2 years	3 years	2 years	4 years

QUALIFIER

As a Division II qualifier, you may practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship during your first year of full-time enrollment at an NCAA Division II school.

- » Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the right areas.
- » Earn a corresponding test score that matches your **core-course GPA** (minimum 2.2) on the **Division II sliding scale**.*
- » Submit your final transcript with proof of graduation to the Eligibility Center.

PARTIAL QUALIFIER

If you have not met all of the Division II academic standards, you will be deemed a partial qualifier. As a partial qualifier, you may practice and receive an athletics scholarship, but may NOT compete, during your first year of full-time enrollment at an NCAA Division II school.
